

Youth Philanthropy Contest Guidelines

THE BASICS

The Fremont Area Community Foundation's Youth Philanthropy Contest is an exciting opportunity for youth to use their creativity, compassion, and talent to make a difference in their community. The Fremont Area Community Foundation wants kids from kindergarten through grade 12 to ask themselves this question:

"How can I make a difference in my community?"

Applicants can submit their best ideas to change the world, right here in their own backyards. Contest winners will receive up to \$1,000 to help implement their projects.

Q&A:

What does it mean to "make a difference?"

We are looking for projects that help our community grow and change for the better and are "philanthropic" in nature. *Philanthropy* is a big word but it can be easily understood as "giving of your time, talents, and treasure for the benefit of all." Here are some questions to help you think about ways to make things better in your community:

- What do I care about?
- How can my caring help others?
- What in my community needs fixing?
- What would make my community a better place?

Your idea could be something you've been thinking about for a while or a totally random spark of

inspiration – as long as it benefits others. You could save something, create something, or change something. Tell us about your best idea for making a difference!

We're looking for project ideas that:

- Have a positive impact on the community
- Can be completed within 9 months
- Take place in the FACF grant area (see map)
- Are charitable in nature (which means it must focus on serving the public interest or common good)
- Engage young people in philanthropy

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Do I have to do this by myself?

Not unless you want to! The contest has three different age-based categories for youth, so find the one that works for you. The winner of each category will receive \$1,000 to complete their community project. In addition, there will be up to four "best of show" projects chosen also! If you add it up, that is potentially \$7,000 worth of great things that will be happening to make our area a better place. See which group you fit into below:

How do I complete an application?

There are a few things that **MUST** be turned in with your application and there are a few additional pieces that may help "sell" your idea to the selection committee and give them a better sense of what you are trying to accomplish. The more you can

demonstrate the details of your project and its impact in the community, the better your chances of being selected.

Required Application Materials:

 Contest Application (all sections must be completed – including a media release for EACH student that participates in your group.)

Optional Things to Include with Your Application:

- Pre-application submission form
- Video (on a cd or flash drive) (*This one is strongly encouraged!*)
- Visual Aids (Posters, display boards, sketches, flow charts, statistics, etc.)
- Photos
- Examples or prototypes of your project if it is a product of some kind

You are HIGHLY encouraged to create some sort of visuals to go with your written application. These will also be necessary when you display your materials at contest events. What is the deadline for this contest?

All applications are due by October 20, 2017. All parts of your application must be received by the deadline. *No late entries will be accepted.*

When do you announce the winners?

Winners will be announced at the Fremont Area Community Foundation Annual Dinner in **November 2017** at the Fremont Golf Club. You will receive more information about this when you turn in your application. *All applicants (or their representatives) with qualifying proposals are required to attend.*

OTHER FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How will I know if you received my application?

We will send a confirmation email to the address you provide on your application.

Is there a way I can get help with my application?

You can always get help by calling 402-721-4252 or email us at info@facfoundation.org with any questions you might have about the contest or application process.

Why should I submit a video, poster or other visual aid?

Visual aids such as videos, posters, or displays help our selection committee better understand your project and the impact that it can have on the community. Use the visuals to sell your idea and tell us why it should be selected for funding.

Are there any guidelines for my video?

Your video must be *2 minutes or less* in length, be appropriate to your project, be in English, and be clear, focused and audible. You must also have the permission of all identifiable individuals (or a parent or guardian if he/she is 17 years of age or younger) in your video. Videos can be placed on youtube.com (please include the link in your application) or submitted on a portable flash drive.

Do I have to make sure my project is approved by the community organization or group that it benefits?

YES! All projects that directly impact a club, group, or organization MUST have approval from those organizations affected by the project for your application to be considered for the contest. Not having permission to move forward with your project should it be selected as a contest winner will disqualify your application. *Please note, however, that we would be happy to help you identify and connect with the organization most likely to be impacted by your project idea. Just give us a call or email.*

Who decides which projects receive funding?

The Youth Philanthropy Contest has a selection committee that will be reviewing all applications. Applicants' identifying information will not be available to the selection committee so that all applications are treated equally.

What happens if my idea is funded?

If your idea is selected for funding, you will be connected to either a non-profit agency or a local service club which will serve as your mentor and help you complete your project and obtain reimbursement for expenditures. The prize money will be granted to the 501(c)(3) organization, not to the individual contest winner.

If you are a contest winner, you will complete an agreement form regarding the implementation of your project, timelines and the reporting guidelines.

Must I report back to the Fremont Area Community Foundation after completing my project? You and your mentor will provide updates to the Fremont Area Community Foundation on your project's progress. When your project is completed, we will ask you to answer a few questions about your project and how it went.

What is the timeline for completing my project?

You have nine months to complete your project from the date you receive your funding.
